SWEETHEARTS HONORED

International Sweethearts of Rhythm

On March 28-April 1, the Smithsonian Institution honored the International Sweethearts of Rhythm (the nation's first all girl, integrated jazz band which was formed in 1937 at The Piney Woods School and went on to receive national acclaim). Dr. Laurence C. Jones formed the band, which included girls of Chinese, Hispanic, Indian, and Caucasian backgrounds, to raise money for the school. The Sweethearts battled racism and sexism to become the hottest all-women's jazz band of the 1940's, playing venues like the Apollo Theater, the Cotton Club, and the Olympia Theatre in Paris. Out of the six remaining Sweethearts who attended the week-long events, five started their careers at The Piney Woods School. President Reginald Nichols presented each with an honorary diploma, and hosted (along with the Mississippi Congressional Delegation) an event honoring the band at the Library of Congress where Senator Thad Cochran and Congressman Gregg Harper were among the dignitaries who paid tribute to the Sweethearts and The Piney Woods School. PWS board member (and daughter of Sweetheart Helen Jones Woods) Cathy Hughes moderated a panel discussion with the ladies. Other board member in attendance were Leonard Goldstein, William Coleman and Laurence C. Jones III. The Smithsonian exhibit detailing the rich legacy of this historic group is on display on the first floor of the National Museum of American History.

Women and Jazz: The International Sweethearts of Rhythm, 1937-1949

of Rhythm was the country's first integrated, all-female big band. Composed primarily of African American and mixed-race women in their teens and early twenties, the Sweethearts also included women of other ethnic origins, including Chinese, Hawaiian, Mexican, Native American, and, later, Caucasian. After turning professional in 1941, the Sweethearts were one of the most popular musical groups in America, performing mainly on the black theater circuit. In 1944, they were named America's "#1 All-Girl Orchestra" by Down Beal magazine. The band continued to be popular into the late 1940s, but ultimately dissolved in 1949.

On **Saturday, April 16**th, the AmeriCorps team will participate in a unique community service/service learning event to be held at the **Lynn Meadows Discovery Center**. We're calling it "**Love Your Beach**". We're joining the **Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Services** who teamed up with the Lynn Meadows Discovery Center and **United Way of South Mississippi** to host "Love Your Beach Day". This event is aimed at middle school aged children and their families and will supply volunteer opportunities to serve areas or organizations affected by the **Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Disaster**. During this event three service projects will be completed: a beach clean up, a food drive to benefit a local Food Bank that has seen increased usage since the oil spill disaster and a service project to benefit the Lynn Meadows Discovery Center. Members will also learn about the effects of oil in our sensitive ecosystems, the effects the oil had on birds and other environmental education about the oil spill disaster. The community service projects and service learning portion of the day is centered on the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Disaster as the one year anniversary is only a few days after Global Youth Service Day. The corps will depart the campus at **5:00 a.m.** and return around **4:30 p.m.**
